A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§329-A Narcotics advisory committee; established. (a)
5	There is established a narcotics advisory committee within the
6	department for administrative purposes. The committee shall be
7	composed of seven members appointed by the governor in
8	accordance with section 26-34. Of the seven members:
9	(1) Four members shall be physicians licensed to prescribe
10	prescription drugs within the scope of the physician's
11	practice in accordance with chapter 453;
12	(2) Two members shall be advanced practice registered
13	nurses licensed under chapter 457; and
14	(3) One member shall be a registered pharmacist, as
15	defined in section 461-1;
16	provided that all members shall be in good standing.
17	(b) All members shall serve a term of four years. Any

vacancies occurring in the membership of the committee shall be

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- 1 filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same
- 2 manner as the original appointments.
- 3 (c) The purpose of the narcotics advisory committee shall
- 4 be to recommend acceptable continuing medical education program
- 5 topics and curriculum to the department's narcotics enforcement
- 6 division, which shall qualify for the per cycle credits required
- 7 by the continuing medical education requirements pursuant to
- **8** section 329-B.
- 9 (d) Members shall serve without compensation, but shall be
- 10 reimbursed for actual expenses, including travel expenses,
- 11 necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 12 §329-B Continuing medical education program; prescribing
- 13 practitioners; narcotics. (a) There shall be established a
- 14 mandatory continuing medical education program for prescribing
- 15 practitioners who prescribe narcotic drugs pursuant to section
- **16** 329-38.
- 17 (b) A prescribing practitioner shall earn four credits
- 18 every two year cycle to maintain the prescribing practitioner's
- 19 state controlled substance registration certificate; provided
- 20 that the credit requirements shall be incorporated into the

- 1 registration certification process via the department's
- 2 registration renewal website.
- 3 (c) Acceptable continuing medical education program topics
- 4 and curriculum shall be determined by the department's narcotics
- 5 enforcement division, in consultation with the narcotics
- 6 advisory committee pursuant to section 329-A."
- 7 SECTION 2. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 8 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 9 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 10 the new sections in this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
