A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CULTURAL EXCHANGES BETWEEN HAWAII AND PUERTO RICO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that since the arrival of
- 2 the first Puerto Ricans in Hawaii on December 23, 1900, the
- 3 Puerto Rican people have contributed significantly to all phases
- 4 of Hawaii's development. The rich culture and proud heritage of
- 5 the Puerto Rican people have been and continue to be positive
- 6 influences upon life in Hawaii. Recognition of the
- 7 contributions of the Puerto Rican people and their culture is
- 8 important to promotion and awareness of Hawaii's diverse and
- 9 multicultural society.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish a Puerto Rican
- 11 exchange commission to coordinate a cultural exchange program
- 12 between Hawaii and Puerto Rico to honor and recognize the
- 13 contributions of the Puerto Rican people and commemorate the
- 14 arrival of the Puerto Ricans to Hawaii.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a temporary
- 16 commission to be known as the Puerto Rican exchange commission
- 17 that shall coordinate cultural exchange events between Hawaii
- 18 and Puerto Rico to honor and recognize the contributions of the



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- 1 Puerto Rican people to Hawaii and to commemorate the arrival of
- 2 the first Puerto Ricans to Hawaii.
- 3 (b) The commission shall be placed within the office of
- 4 the governor for administrative purposes and shall cease to
- 5 operate after June 30, 2017.
- 6 SECTION 3. (a) The Puerto Rican exchange commission shall
- 7 consist of fifteen members to be appointed by the governor
- 8 without regard to section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Of
- 9 the fifteen members:
- 10 (1) One member shall be from the Puerto Rican Heritage
- Society of Hawaii;
- 12 (2) One member shall be from the United Puerto Rican
- Association of Hawaii, Inc.;
- 14 (3) One member shall be from the Puerto Rican Association
- of Maui;
- 16 (4) One member shall be from the Kohala Puerto Rican
- 17 Association;
- 18 (5) One member shall be from the Kauai Puerto Rican
- 19 Association; and

1	(6)	Ten members shall represent government, labor,	
2		business, culture and the arts, and the community at	
3		large.	
4	(b)	The chair of the commission shall be selected by the	
5	commission members.		
6	(c)	The members shall not receive compensation for their	
7	services	but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses,	
8	including travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their		
9	duties under this Act.		
10	SECT	ION 4. (a) The Puerto Rican exchange commission	
11	shall:		
12	(1)	Develop, plan, and coordinate various cultural	
13		exchange programs and activities between Hawaii and	
14		Puerto Rico that honor and recognize the contributions	
15		of the Puerto Rican people to the State, including but	
16		not limited to the following:	
17		(A) Workshops teaching Hawaiian dance and lei making;	
18		(B) Music performances; and	
19		(C) Art presentations;	
20	(2)	Encourage the participation of all segments of the	
21		Puerto Rican community in the exchange program;	

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1	(3)	consider any related plans and programs developed by	
2		the Puerto Rican Heritage Society; the United Puerto	
3		Rican Association of Hawaii, Inc.; the Puerto Rican	
4		Association of Maui; the Kohala Puerto Rican	
5		Association; the Kauai Puerto Rican Association; and	
6		other interested private and public organizations or	
7		agencies from whose members the commission may	
8		designate special committees to plan, develop, and	
9		coordinate specific projects or activities; and	
10	(4)	Design and construct a monument to commemorate the	
11		arrival of the first Puerto Rican people to Hawaii	
12		that shall be donated to Puerto Rico and be placed at	
13		a location that best represents where the first Puerto	
14		Ricans began their journey to Hawaii.	
15	(b)	Prior to the convening of the regular session of 2016,	
16	the commi	ssion shall submit to the governor a comprehensive	
17	report for the cultural exchange program that shall include but		
18	not be li	mited to:	
19	(1)	The production, publication, and distribution of	

educational materials about the Hawaiian culture;

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Ţ	(2) If a verifing exhibits, other exhibits, ce	remonies,	
2	theatrical productions, and other spec	ial events	
3	portraying the Hawaiian culture; and		
4	(3) Images of the monument to commemorate	the arrival of	
5	the first Puerto Rican people to Hawai	i.	
6	(c) At the end of its term, the commission	shall submit to	
7	the governor a final report of all its activitie	s, including an	
8	accounting of all moneys received and disbursed.		
9	SECTION 5. All property acquired by the co	mmission shall	
10	be deposited for preservation in the Hawaii stat	e public library	
11	system, museums, or public archives.		
12	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of th	e general	
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$	or so	
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and		
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
16	year 2016-2017 for developing, planning, and coordinating		
17	various programs and events as part of a cultural exchange		
18	program with Puerto Rico and construction of a monument to		
19	commemorate the arrival of the first Puerto Rica	n people to	
20	Hawaii.		

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 2 the governor for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
