### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that inaccurate reporting
- 2 of payroll and personnel information has the potential to cause
- 3 the inaccurate calculation of pension amounts by the employees'
- 4 retirement system. Under section 88-103.7, Hawaii Revised
- 5 Statutes, the employees' retirement system has the authority to
- 6 request payroll information from departments and agencies of the
- 7 state and county governments; however, there is no provision of
- 8 law providing a penalty or remedy for the failure to provide
- 9 requested information to the employees' retirement system.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that the employees'
- 11 retirement system is provided with accurate payroll and
- 12 personnel information so that it can accurately calculate
- 13 pension amounts and to establish penalties and remedies against
- 14 departments and agencies of the state and county governments.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 88-103.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:

2.	<u>(a)</u> To f	ulfill its responsibilities under this chapter, the
3	system [m	ay] shall require any department or agency of the State
4	or counti	es to furnish information to the system to carry out
5	the purpo	ses of this chapter. The system [may] shall specify
6	the forma	t in which the information shall be furnished. Without
7	limitatio	n of the foregoing, the system [may] shall require that
8	informati	on be furnished in electronic format and that
9	informati	on with respect to payroll and personnel transactions:
10	(1)	Allocate payments, including bonuses, salary
11		adjustments, payments for compensatory time, and
12		workers' compensation, to monthly or other periods as
13		requested by the system; [and]
14	(2)	Specify the purpose or nature of the payment[+]; and
15	(3)	Indicate any changes or errors in payments that
16		require correcting or updating.
17	(b)	All departments and agencies of the State and
18	counties,	as applicable, shall furnish the information required
19	by the sy	stem pursuant to this section in the format required by
20	the syste	m. The system shall notify each department or agency
21	of the St	ate or counties that is required to furnish information

- 1 to the system of any change in the required format for the
- 2 information. Each department or agency shall have one hundred
- 3 eighty days from the date of receipt of the notice of a change
- 4 in the required format to update the format in which the
- 5 required information is provided to the system.
- 6 (c) If a department or agency of the State or county fails
- 7 to furnish the system with the information required pursuant to
- 8 this section, the State or county shall pay to the system, on
- 9 the first day of the fiscal year following the fiscal year in
- 10 which the failure to furnish the required information occurred,
- 11 an amount equal to the employer contributions payable by the
- 12 State or county resulting from the department or agency that is
- 13 not in compliance with this section during the fiscal year in
- 14 which the failure to furnish the required information occurred.
- 15 This amount shall be applied to contributions required under
- 16 section 88-124 for the State and section 88-126 for the
- 17 counties.
- 18 (d) If full payment of the amount required under
- 19 subsection (c) is not made by the State or county on the first
- 20 day of the fiscal year, then:

1	<u>(1)</u>	Any unpaid amounts shall bear interest at the rate
2		equal to the investment yield rate assumption in
3		effect for actuarial valuations of the system; and
4	(2)	Any payments received by the system for the State or
5		county, except for payments made pursuant to sections
6		88-46, 88-100, and 88-326, shall be applied first to
7		accrued interest and then to the amount required to be
8		paid under subsection (c).
9	<u>(e)</u>	The system may waive the requirements of subsections
10	(c) and (	d) if the system determines, in its sole discretion,
11	that the	failure by the department or agency to furnish the
12	required	information in the required format is the result of an
13	unforesee	n system failure, natural disaster, or other unforeseen
14	event.	
15	(f)	The system shall annually submit to the department of
16	budget an	d finance and legislature, no later than twenty days
17	prior to	the convening of each regular session, a report that
18	details t	he following for the current fiscal year:
19	(1)	Any department or agency of the State or counties that
20		has been found in violation of this section; and

1	(2) Any amounts required to be paid under subsection (c),
2	including the anticipated amounts payable in the
3	upcoming fiscal year, and identification of any state
4	budget programs that may be affected."
5	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
