A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to address the
2	intercolle	egiate athletics program of the University of Hawaii.
3	More	specifically, this Act:
4	(1)	Appropriates moneys from the tourism special fund for
5		fiscal year 2016-2017 for travel expenses and
6		subsidies incurred for the intercollegiate athletics
7		program of the University of Hawaii; and
8	(2)	Requires the governor to determine whether the funding
9		from the tourism special fund of the travel expenses
10		and subsidies of the intercollegiate athletics program
11		of the University of Hawaii should continue beyond
12		fiscal year 2016-2017. If the governor determines
13		that the funding should continue, then the governor is
14		required to take appropriate action to implement the
15		funding.
16	The :	intercollegiate athletics program of the University of
17	Hawaii is	unique. The costs for University of Hawaii athletes
18	to travel	to the mainland are high. Moreover, the University



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must subsidize the travel expenses of some visiting teams that
 come to Hawaii.

3 The legislature finds that the community places a high 4 value on and takes much pride in the intercollegiate athletics 5 program of the University of Hawaii. All teams and individuals 6 competing for the University of Hawaii have dedicated fans who 7 enjoy the efforts of the athletes and entertainment of sports contests. In contemporary society, intercollegiate athletics 8 receive much publicity and media coverage, and the participation 9 10 of the University of Hawaii in various sports increases the exposure of people on the mainland and in foreign countries to 11 the State of Hawaii. University of Hawaii athletes are also 12 "ambassadors of Aloha" when they travel out-of-state, and 13 athletes have an opportunity to uniquely and authentically 14 15 represent Hawaii. University of Hawaii games and events that are televised nationally and internationally also are important 16 marketing tools to attract visitors to the State and showcase a 17 premier higher education institution. Family, friends, and 18 19 supporters of visiting schools often accompany the teams and 20 stay for an extended time after the games.



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1 Consequently, the legislature finds that expenditures from 2 the tourism special fund, the proceeds of which are primarily 3 derived from the transient accommodations tax, are justifiable 4 for the travel expenses and subsidies incurred by the University 5 of Hawaii for its intercollegiate athletics program.

6 The legislature further finds that the governor should 7 determine whether the use of tourism special funds for travel 8 expenses and subsidies of the intercollegiate athletic program 9 of the University of Hawaii should continue beyond the fiscal 10 year 2016-2017.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the tourism special fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the payment of travel expenses and travel subsidies incurred for the intercollegiate athletic program of the University of Hawaii.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of18 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary
20 in chapters 201B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, chapter 237D, Hawaii
21 Revised Statutes, or any other law, the expenditure of the

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appropriation in section 2 for the purpose specified in that 1 2 section for fiscal year 2016-2017 shall be authorized. 3 SECTION 4. (a) The governor shall determine whether the 4 travel expenses and subsidies incurred for the intercollegiate 5 athletics program of the University of Hawaii should continue to 6 be funded from the tourism special fund beyond fiscal year 2016-2017. 7 If the governor determines that the funding from the 8 (b) tourism special fund for the intercollegiate athletics program 9 10 of the University of Hawaii should continue, the governor: Shall include an appropriation request in the 11 (1) executive budget for fiscal biennium 2017-2019 to 12 implement the funding from the tourism special fund; 13 14 and 15 (2) May recommend necessary amendments to chapter 201B or chapter 237D, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016. 17

University of Hawaii Intercollegiate Athletics Program; Tourism Special Fund Appropriation

Description:

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Makes an appropriation from the tourism special fund for fiscal year 2016-2017 for travel expenses and subsidies incurred by the intercollegiate athletics program of the University of Hawaii. Requires the governor to determine whether the funding for the travel expenses and subsidies should continue beyond fiscal year 2016-2017. Requires, if determining that such funding should continue, the governor to take appropriate action to implement the determination. (SD1)
