# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, sought to revamp education in Hawaii, in part, by creating an interagency working group to develop plans for transferring certain rights, powers, functions, duties, and resources from various state departments to the department of education. This interagency working group ceased to exist on June 30, 2007.

8 The legislature further finds that the establishment of 9 such interagency working groups facilitates interagency 10 communication and in particular, will help address various 11 issues that either have not been fully resolved since Act 51 or 12 have arisen as a result of transfers implemented pursuant to Act 13 51.

14 The purpose of this Act, therefore, is to improve the 15 delivery of school health services by establishing and 16 appropriating funds for an interagency working group to create a 17 comprehensive school health program.

thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 for the
work of the interagency working group established in section 2
of this Act.

10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of11 education for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
2015.
