A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws
of Hawaii 2004, sought to revamp education in Hawaii, in part,
by creating an interagency working group to develop plans for
transferring certain rights, powers, functions, duties, and
resources from various state departments to the department of
education. This interagency working group ceased to exist on
June 30, 2007.

8 The legislature further finds that the establishment of 9 such interagency working groups facilitates interagency 10 communication and in particular, will help address various 11 issues that either have not been fully resolved since Act 51 or 12 have arisen as a result of transfers implemented pursuant to Act 13 51.

14 The purpose of this Act, therefore, is to improve the 15 delivery of school health services by establishing an 16 interagency working group to create a comprehensive school 17 health program.



1	SECI	TION 2. (a) The department of education and department
2	of health	shall jointly convene an interagency working group to
3	discuss a	and create a comprehensive school health program that
4	includes	a comprehensive, sustainable plan to address, at
5	minimum,	issues relating to:
6	(1)	The development of a school health program
7		infrastructure and a recommendation regarding the
8		department in which to place such a program to ensure
9		what is best for students attending department of
10		education schools;
11	(2)	The transfer of health aides from the department of
12		health to the department of education;
13	(3)	The training of department of education employees and
14		agents relating to the administration of medication to
15		students by the department of health;
16	(4)	The authorization of department of education employees
17		to receive and administer auto-injectable epinephrine
18		to students experiencing anaphylaxis;
19	(5)	The provision of care by department of education
20		employees to students with diabetes pursuant to a
21		student's medical management plan;

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1	(6)	The need for mental health counselor, nurse, and
2		health aide positions in the public schools;
3	(7)	The identification of existing barriers and mechanisms
4		necessary to maximize all relevant and available
5		federal funds for services that may be offered through
6		the school health program; and
7	(8)	Any personnel issues that may arise as a result of the
8		comprehensive plan, including the transfer of
9		personnel from one department to another.
10	(b)	Members of the working group shall include:
11	(1)	The superintendent of education or the
12		superintendent's designee, who shall serve as a co-
13		chair;
14	(2)	The director of health or the director's designee, who
15		shall serve as a co-chair;
16	(3)	The chair of the senate standing committee on
17		education or the chair's designee;
18	(4)	The chair of the house of representatives standing
19		committee on education or the chair's designee;
20	(5)	The chair of the senate standing committee on health
21		or the chair's designee;

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1	(6)	The chair of the house of representatives standing
2		committee on health or the chair's designee;
3	(7)	A representative from the special education section of
4		the department of education's curriculum and
5		instruction branch;
6	(8)	A representative from the comprehensive student
7		support services section of the department of
8		education's student support branch;
9	(9)	A representative from the healthcare contracts and
10		reimbursement program of the department of education's
11		office of fiscal services;
12	(10)	A department of education complex area superintendent
13		or principal, to be chosen by the superintendent of
14		education;
15	(11)	The chief of the department of health's public health
16		nursing branch or the chief's designee;
17	(12)	The chief of the department of health's family health
18		services division or the chief's designee;
19	(13)	The administrator of the department of human services'
20		med-QUEST division or the administrator's designee;

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1	(14)	A representative from the American Academy of
2		Pediatrics, Hawaii chapter;
3	(15)	A family representative of a child with special health
4		needs, to be chosen by the governor;
5	(16)	A family representative of a child with general needs,
6		to be chosen by the governor;
7	(17)	The dean of the University of Hawaii at Manoa's school
8		of nursing and dental hygiene or the dean's designee;
9	(18)	The dean of Kapiolani community college's health
10		sciences department or the dean's designee;
11	(19)	A representative from a federally qualified community
12		health center, to be chosen by the governor;
13	(20)	A representative from Papa Ola Lokahi;
14	(21)	A former innovative zone health care coordinator from
15		the department of education, to be chosen by the
16		superintendent of education; and
17	(22)	Any other person the superintendent of education and
18		director of health deem necessary for the success of
19		the working group.
20	(C)	The working group shall submit an interim report of
21	its findi	ngs and recommendations, including any proposed

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1	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior		
2	to the convening of the regular session of 2016. The interim		
3	report sh	all, at minimum, include:	
4	(1)	A finalized list of the membership of the working	
5		group;	
6	(2)	Information on the progress made toward developing the	
7		infrastructure of a school health program with a	
8		comprehensive, sustainable plan;	
9	(3)	A proposed work plan, timelines, and responsible	
10		parties therefor; and	
11	(4)	Recommendations concerning processes to maximize	
12		applicable federal matching funds for services	
13		provided through the school health program.	
14	(d)	The working group shall submit a final report of its	
15	findings	and recommendations, including any proposed	
16	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior	
17	to the convening of the regular session of 2017. The final		
18	report shall include all findings:		
19	(1)	Concerning the infrastructure necessary to establish a	
20		comprehensive, sustainable school health program; and	

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1	(2)	Related to a sustainability plan with quality
2		assurance and quality improvement parameters,
3		including specific performance measures and goals for
4		continued sustainability.
5	(e)	No member of the interagency working group shall be
6	made subj	ect to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely
7	because o	f that member's participation as a member of the
8	interagen	cy working group.
9	(f)	The interagency working group shall cease to exist on
10	December	31, 2016.

11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
