A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. According to the United States Census Bureau
and the department of business, economic development, and
tourism statistics, nearly 40 per cent of private residences on
O'ahu were built in 1969 or earlier. In certain census tracts,
this number is as high as 85 per cent.

Hawai'i law provides that any building, structure, object, 6 district, area, or site over fifty years old is considered 7 historic property. Further, current application of historic 8 preservation law requires review by the state historic 9 preservation division of the department of land and natural 10 resources prior to the granting of permits for proposed projects 11 on historic properties. This requirement, in certain instances, 12 has delayed the granting of permits, which has had a negative 13 impact on development. As nearly 40 per cent of residential 14 properties on O'ahu have reached or are approaching fifty years 15 of age, it is prudent for the State to reexamine the current 16 processes and procedures regarding historic properties. 17

13	(2)	Require the department of land and natural resources
14		to develop a list of types of projects that have no
15		potential to affect a historic property and a list of
16		the types of properties likely to be eligible for
17		inclusion in the Hawaii register of historic places
18		and to provide those lists to the counties; and
19	(3)	Require the department of land and natural resources
20		to develop a plan for completing a comprehensive
21		inventory of historic buildings in the State.



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1	SECTION 2. Section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended by amending the definition of "historic property" to	
3	read as follows:	
4	""Historic property" means any building, structure, object,	
5	district, area, or site, including heiau and underwater site,	
6	[which] that is over fifty years old[-] and is significant in	
7	Hawaii's history, architecture, archeology, engineering, or	
8	culture."	
9	SECTION 3. (a) The department of land and natural	
10	resources shall:	
11	(1) Develop a list of the types of projects that have no	
12	potential to affect a historic property and provide	
13	the list to the counties no later than October 1,	
14	2015; and	
15	(2) Develop a list of the types of properties likely to be	
16	eligible for inclusion in the Hawaii register of	
17	historic places and provide the list to the counties	
18	no later than January 2, 2016.	
19	(b) Properties not included in or eligible for inclusion	
20	in the Hawaii register of historic places and projects of the	
21	types identified in the list developed pursuant to subsection	

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(a) (1) shall not be subject to review under section 6E-42,
Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the counties shall not submit such
projects to the department for review under section 6E-42,
Hawaii Revised Statutes.

5 SECTION 4. The department of land and natural resources 6 shall develop a plan for completing a comprehensive inventory of 7 historic buildings in the State and shall submit the plan, 8 together with a proposed budget for implementation of the plan, 9 to the legislature no later than fourteen days prior to the 10 convening of the regular session of 2016.

SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Department of Land and Natural Resources; Historic Property; Definition; Inventory of Historic Buildings

Description:

Includes only buildings, structures, objects, districts, areas, or sites that are significant in Hawaii's history, architecture, archeology, engineering, or culture in the definition of "historic property". Requires the department of land and natural resources to provide the counties with a list that identifies the types of projects that have no potential to affect a historic property and the types of properties likely to be eligible for inclusion in the Hawaii register of historic places; develop a plan for completing a comprehensive inventory of historic buildings in the State; and submit a plan, together with a proposed budget, to the legislature.
