### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 356D-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 2 mandates that the state low-income public housing program must
- 3 be self-supporting. However the rental income at the state
- 4 housing facilities is insufficient. As a consequence many of
- 5 the expenses of day-to-day operations are currently subsidized
- 6 using the small general fund appropriation the Hawaii public
- 7 housing authority receives for annual repair and maintenance and
- 8 the housing authority's revolving funds.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to provide the Hawaii public
- 10 housing authority with general funds to assist and support the
- 11 state low-income public housing program with service contracts
- 12 such as trash removal, security services, management contracts,
- 13 tree removal, and other similar types of annual service
- 14 contracts. These funds will also provide the housing authority
- 15 with the ability to develop long-term state housing plans, based
- 16 on studies, which the agency is currently unable to contract for

- 1 due to the limited cash flow from the state low-income housing
- 2 program.
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 6 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 7 2016-2017 to assist and support the Hawaii public housing
- 8 authority's state low-income public housing program.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 9
- 10 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
