A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that current law allows a
- 2 person who has attained the age of seventy-one to renew a
- 3 driver's license for a period of eight years; however, a person
- 4 who has attained the age of seventy-two is only permitted to
- 5 renew a driver's license for a two-year period. The result is
- 6 that one person may renew a license at the age of seventy-one
- 7 and will hold a valid license until the age of eighty, which is
- 8 the first birthday eight years from date of issuance, while
- 9 another person may renew a license at the age of seventy-two and
- 10 will hold a valid license only until they reach the age of
- 11 seventy-five, which is the first birthday two years from the
- 12 date of issuance. The legislature finds that the current non-
- 13 graduated driver's license expiration period is arbitrary.
- 14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to create a
- 15 graduated system of driver's license renewal for persons of a
- 16 certain age or older.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:

21		of issuance, whichever is later; provided that the
22		licensee submits to the examiner of drivers a form, as

2		qualified duly licensed medical practitioner within
3		the previous thirty days certifying that the licensee
4		meets the required medical qualifications for a
5		driver's license; and
6	(3)	If the licensee is a legal immigrant, the license
7		shall expire no later than the licensee's authorized
8		period of stay in the United States.
9	<u>(b)</u>	The examiner of drivers may issue a license for a
10	shorter period if the licensee has a physical condition or	
11	conditions that the examiner of drivers reasonably believes may	
12	impair the driver's ability to drive."	
13	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
15	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Expiration of Motor Vehicle Licenses; Issuance; Renewal; Age

Description:

Requires that a driver's license issued to a person who is an unspecified years of age or older, at the time of issuance, shall expire on the licensee's unspecified birthday, or two years from the date of license issuance, whichever is later in time. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
