A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FAILURE TO REPORT A MISSING CHILD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that current state		
2	law does not address the situation where a parent, legal		
3	guardian, or other person legally charged with the care or		
4	custody of a child fails to report the death or disappearance of		
5	the child, or where a caregiver actively conceals a child's		
6	death or disappearance. However, the legislature recognizes		
7	that state law should penalize any caregiver who fails to report		
8	a child's death or disappearance.		
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 709, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately		
11 .	designated and to read as follows:		
12	"§709- Failure to report a missing child. (1) A		
13	caregiver in custody of a child commits the offense of failure		
14	to report a missing child if:		
15	(a) The child is under the age of sixteen;		
16	(b) The caregiver knowingly or negligently fails to verify		
17	the safety and whereabouts of the child for a period		
18	in excess of forty-eight hours; and		

1	<u>(c)</u>	The caregiver knowingly or negligently fails to report
2		the child as missing to a law enforcement agency upon
3		the expiration of the forty-eight hour period.
4	(2)	Nothing in this section shall preclude prosecution and
5	convictio	on of the caregiver for:
6	<u>(a)</u>	Any applicable degree of criminal homicide under
7		chapter 707, part II;
8	<u>(b)</u>	Reckless endangering under sections 707-713 and
9		707-714;
10	<u>(c)</u>	Child abuse under chapter 707, part VI;
11	<u>(d)</u>	Concealing the corpse of an infant under section
12		709-901;
13	<u>(e)</u>	Endangering the welfare of a minor under sections
14		709-903.5 and 709-904;
15	<u>(f)</u>	Abuse of family and household members under section
16		709-906; or
17	<u>(g)</u>	Any other applicable offense.
18	(3)	For the purposes of this section, "caregiver" means a
19	parent, l	egal guardian, or other person legally charged with the
20	care or c	ustody of a child.
21	(4)	Failure to report a missing child is a class C felony.

1	§709- Failure to report the death of a child. (1) A
2	caregiver commits the offense of failure to report the death of
3	a child if a caregiver fails to report the death of a child who
4	was under the caregiver's custody to a law enforcement agency
5	within two hours of the discovery of the child's death.
6	(2) For the purposes of this section:
7	"Caregiver" means a parent, legal guardian, or other person
8	legally charged with the care or custody of a child.
9	"Child" means a person under the age of eighteen years.
10	(3) A person who violates this section commits a class C
11	felony.
12	§709- Giving false information to law enforcement
13	regarding a missing child. (1) A caregiver commits the offense
14	of giving false information to law enforcement regarding a
15	missing child if the caregiver knowingly gives false information
16	to a law enforcement officer with the intent to mislead the
17	officer or impede either a missing person investigation or a
18	felony criminal investigation that involves a child who is in
19	the caregiver's care.
20	(2) For the purposes of this section:

"Caregiver" means a parent, legal guardian, or other person 1 2 legally charged with the care or custody of a child. 3 "Child" means a person under the age of eighteen years. (3) A person who violates this section commits a class C 4 5 felony." SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 7 8 begun before its effective date. 9 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
