# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SHOOTING RANGE PROTECTION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1  | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that shooting ranges in         |

| 2  | this State serve as valuable resources for target shooting and   |
| 3  | firearm safety training. Shooting ranges and target shooting     |
| 4  | facilities are important public recreation resources and provide |
| 5  | opportunities for law enforcement agencies and personnel to      |

| 7  | The continued existence and viability of shooting ranges are     |
| 8  | impacted by burdensome retroactive regulation and lawsuits,      |
| 9  | threatening the availability of vital firearms training for      |
| 10 | local law enforcement agencies, hunters, and the general public. |
| 11 | SECTION 2. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is              |
| 12 | amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated   |
| 13 | and to read as follows:  |
| 14 | "§134- Sport shooting ranges; protection. (a)                    |
| 15 | Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person who         |
| 16 | operates or uses a sport shooting range in the State shall not   |
| 17 | be subject to civil liability or criminal prosecution in any     |
| 18 | matter relating to noise or noise pollution resulting from the   |

         (b) A person who operates or uses a sport shooting range

         (c) Rules adopted by a state department or agency to limit

    noise decibel levels that may occur in the outdoor atmosphere

    shall not apply to sport shooting ranges if the rules are
    adopted and apply to the period after the date of initial

    construction and operation of the range.

         (d) A person who acquires title to or who owns real

    property adversely affected by the use of a permanently affixed

    sport shooting range shall not maintain a nuisance action

    against an individual who owns the range to restrain, enjoin, or

    impede the use of the range where there has not been a

    substantial change in the nature of the use of the range.

         (e) Any sport shooting range that is operated pursuant to

    existing law at the time of enactment of an ordinance shall be
    permitted continued operational use of the shooting range

    despite nonconformance to a new ordinance or an amendment to an

         (f) A person who participates in sport shooting at a sport

    shooting range accepts obvious and inherent risks associated
    with participation in the sport, including but not limited to

    or shot, malfunction of sport shooting equipment not owned by

    the shooting range, natural variations in terrain, surface, or

    subsurface, weather conditions, bare spots, rocks, trees, and

         (g) Except as otherwise provided in this section, this

    section shall not prohibit local government from regulating the
