A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOBBYISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 97, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: 4 "§97- Mandatory lobbyist training course. (a) All 5 lobbyists who are registered pursuant to section 97-2 shall 6 annually complete a lobbyist training course administered by the 7 state ethics commission. 8 The state ethics commission shall establish, design, 9 supervise, and conduct lobbyist training designed specifically 10 for registered lobbyists that shall include: 11 Education and training in the lobbying laws set forth (1)12 in this chapter; 13 Explanations and discussions of the lobbying laws, (2) 14 administrative rules, and relevant internal 15 procedures; 16 Specific technical and legal requirements; (3)

5	The state	ethics commission shall develop the methods and
6	prepare a	ny materials necessary to implement the course.
7	(C)	The state ethics commission shall:
8	(1)	Administer the lobbyist training course;
9	(2)	Designate members of its legal staff to conduct the
10		lobbyist training course; and
11	(3)	Notify each registered lobbyist that attendance is
12		mandatory.
13	<u>(d)</u>	The state ethics commission shall conduct a lobbyist
14	training	course in January of each year and may repeat the
15	course as	necessary to accommodate all lobbyists who are
16	required	to attend. The course shall be for a period of at
17	<u>least two</u>	hours."
18	SECT	ION 2. Section 97-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended t	o read as follows:

- 2 Every lobbyist shall file a registration form with the state
- 3 ethics commission within five days of becoming a lobbyist.
- 4 (b) Each lobbyist shall provide and certify the following
- 5 information:
- 6 (1) The name, mailing address, and business telephone
- 7 number of the lobbyist.
- **8** (2) The name and principal place of business of each
- 9 person by whom the lobbyist is retained or employed or
- on whose behalf the lobbyist appears or works and a
- 11 written authorization to act as a lobbyist from each
- person by whom the lobbyist is employed or with whom
- 13 the lobbyist contracts.
- 14 (3) The subject areas on which the lobbyist expects to
- 15 lobby.
- 16 (c) A lobbyist shall report any change in any of the
- 17 information contained in the registration statement within ten
- 18 days after the change has occurred.
- 19 (d) A lobbyist shall file a notice of termination within
- 20 ten days after the lobbyist ceases the activity which required
- 21 the lobbyist's registration. The lobbyist and the employer of

5	administe	red by the state ethics commission annually, as
6	required	under section 97
7	[(e)] <u>(f)</u> This chapter shall not apply to:
8	(1)	Any individual who represents oneself and not any
9		other person before the legislature or administrative
10		agency; provided that such individual [must] shall
11		nonetheless file a statement of expenditures if the
12		individual meets any of the provisions of section
13		97-3(a);
14	(2)	Any federal, state, or county official or employee
15		acting in the official's or employee's official
16		capacity, unless the federal, state, or county
17		official[$ au$] or employee contracts for the services of
18		a lobbyist;
19	(3)	Any elected public official acting in the public
20		official's official capacity, unless the public
21		official contracts for the services of a lobbyist;

(4)	Any newspaper or other regularly published periodical
	or radio or television station (including any
	individual who owns, publishes, or is employed by a
	newspaper or periodical or radio or television
	station) while publishing in the regular course of
	business news items, editorials $[\tau]$ or other comments,
	or paid advertisements, which directly or indirectly
	urge the passage or defeat of legislative or
	administrative action;

- (5) Any attorney who advises the attorney's clients on the construction or effect of proposed legislative or administrative action; provided that such attorney must nonetheless register if the attorney meets any of the provisions of section 97-1(6); and
- (6) Any person who possesses special skills and knowledge relevant to certain areas of legislation, whose skills and knowledge may be helpful to the legislative and executive branches of state government, and who makes an occasional appearance at the request of the legislature [or], an administrative agency, or [the] a lobbyist [even though receiving] regardless of whether

1	or not the person receives reimbursement or other
2	payment from the legislature $[\frac{\partial \mathbf{r}}{\partial t}]$, an administrative
3	agency, or $[\frac{\text{the}}{a}]$ a lobbyist for the appearance."
4	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
