## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE EQUIPMENT NECESSARY FOR A FULL-SERVICE CONVENTIONAL KITCHEN AT KEAUKAHA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AND TO PROVIDE NECESSARY POSITIONS TO OPERATE THE KITCHEN.

WHEREAS, the Department of Education successfully completed the building of a new cafetorium with a serving kitchen for Keaukaha Elementary School in 2015; and

WHEREAS, Act 180, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, appropriated \$8,000,000 for plans, design, construction, and equipment for a new cafeteria, ground and site improvements, equipment, and appurtenances for Keaukaha Elementary School on the island of Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, the Senate Committee on Ways and Means has added additional appropriations to the fiscal year 2016-2017 budget for capital improvement projects related to kitchen equipment and facilities in public schools; and

WHEREAS, most of the Keaukaha Elementary School cafeteria staff positions were moved to another school in the complex area while the new cafetorium was constructed; and

WHEREAS, the Keaukaha Elementary School and Keaukaha community have continuously requested to have the kitchen be a full-service conventional kitchen and have their kitchen positions returned; and

WHEREAS, a full-service conventional kitchen adequately equipped and staffed is necessary for Keaukaha Elementary School and the community it serves; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2016, the 12
