SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO DEVELOP A PLAN THAT OUTLINES COORDINATION AMONG UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII CAMPUSES IN INCREASING ONLINE COURSES.

WHEREAS, online courses and degree programs are increasingly important to ensure access to education for many students; and

WHEREAS, the geography of Hawaii makes online and distance education options especially valuable in the State, both for local and out-of-state students; and

WHEREAS, students on neighbor islands are in particular need of affordable, high quality distance education options; and

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii offers only two fully online degree programs, in contrast to sixteen online degree programs offered at comparable institutions; and

WHEREAS, some universities offer significantly more online degree programs, such as East Carolina University, which offers over seventy-five online degree programs, and Penn State, which offers over one hundred online degree programs; and

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii is well situated to offer a unique and valuable perspective to local and out-of-state students in a variety of important subject areas, including oceanography, renewable energy, and climate change; and

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii has been a national leader in providing distance education options to students in the past; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2016, the House of Representatives concurring, that the University of Hawaii is requested to develop a plan that outlines cooperation amongst the University of Hawaii campuses in increasing online courses and degree programs; and
