Your Committee on Hawaiian Affairs, to which was referred H.B. No. 2458, H.D. 2, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose and intent of this measure is to require a wholesale rate of an unspecified per cent of general excise taxes to apply to the gross proceeds of sale or gross income arising from the sale of all products produced from Hawaiian loko i'a.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure from the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Aha Moku Advisory Committee, Makaha Hawaiian Civic Club, and one individual. Your Committee received testimony in opposition to this measure from the Department of the Attorney General. Your Committee received comments on this measure from the Department of Taxation and Tax Foundation of Hawaii.

Your Committee finds that Hawaiian loko i'a are culturally significant and valuable to the State of Hawaii. Your Committee further finds that this measure helps to preserve the practice of sustainable aquaculture.

Your Committee has heard the concerns of the Department of Taxation regarding the administrative burden of creating a new tax rate exclusively for Hawaiian loko i'a products and the concerns of

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the Department of the Attorney General regarding the Commerce Clause of the United States Constitution.

Accordingly, your Committee has amended this measure by:

- Inserting one-half of one percent as the amount of the wholesale general excise tax rate;
- (2) Amending the definition of "Hawaiian loko i'a" to further clarify that the tax rate shall not discriminate against interstate commerce; and
- (3) Inserting an effective date of July 1, 2050, to encourage further discussion.

Your Committee notes the concerns of the Department of Taxation relating to identification of Hawaiian loko i'a products and requests that if your Committee on Ways and Means decides to hear this measure, it consider S.B. No. 537, S.D. 1, Regular Session of 2015, as a resource for guidance.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Hawaiian Affairs that is attached to this report, your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of H.B. No. 2458, H.D. 2, as amended herein, and recommends that it pass Second Reading in the form attached hereto as H.B. No. 2458, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, and be referred to your Committee on Ways and Means.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaiian loko i'a 2 (fishponds) are unique aquacultural systems that are an integral part of Hawaiian culture. Loko i'a are environmentally 3 sustainable aquacultural enterprises, which also provide 4 5 cultural benefits to Hawaii, employment opportunities, and 6 fishstock enhancement. Fishpond production provides a highly 7 desirable food source for local communities and offers income 8 for the fishpond operator. While fishpond production is 9 potentially profitable, profit margins are small. 10 The legislature further finds that products produced by 11 Hawaiian loko i'a should be taxed at the wholesale rate of one-12 half of one per cent to help promote the cultivation of loko i'a. 13 Chapter 237, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 2.

14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows:

16 "§237- Products produced by Hawaiian loko i'a; wholesale
17 rate. (a) The wholesale rate of one-half of one per cent shall

4	(b) For purposes of this section, "Hawaiian loko i'a" means			
5	the unique, traditional system and methodology of aquaculture

7	Generally referred to as "loko i'a", the system mastered by			
8	ancient Hawaiians includes but is not limited to loko kuapa,			
9	loko umeiki, and loko pu'uone. Loko i'a are natural or			
10	artificial enclosures; loko kuapa are enclosures built upon a			
11	reef, loko umeiki are a type of permanent fish-trap structure,			
12	and loko pu'uone are enclosed by sand. The term includes			
13	fishponds built outside of the State of Hawaii. The term			
14	excludes any fishpond designed in a manner or constructed for			
15	purposes other than those associated with traditional loko i'a			
16	management and culture."			
17	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.			
18	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
