"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to promote expansion and diversification of Hawaii's economy by supporting the high technology industry. Specifically, this measure works to retain and attract talented individuals to work in Hawaii by appropriating funds to the High Technology Development Corporation to develop a program to attract out-of-state software programmers and other high technology workers to work in Hawaii.

The High Technology Development Corporation and Chamber of Commerce Hawaii testified in support of the intent of this measure. A concerned individual testified in opposition.

The growth, development, and prosperity of the high technology industry in Hawaii helps to drive expansion and diversification of Hawaii's economy. The expansion and proliferation of this sector helps the State adapt to an everchanging economic and technological landscape and prepare for the future. However, one barrier to growth of the high technology industry in Hawaii is the disconnect between the availability and creation of high wage technology sector jobs and the expansion of the labor force to fill these positions. Your Committee finds that this measure works to address this issue.
