Clarifies the supervision requirements for licensure of clinical social workers, including permitting the supervision requirements to be met through face-to-face supervision or via a Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act-compliant video conferencing service. (HB2169 HD1)	HUS, CPC
<u>HB 2233, HD1</u> (HSCR547-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS. Requires every physician, osteopathic physician, or surgeon to: (1) complete a continuing medical education course that focuses on health issues with significant public health impact to the State; and (2) meet the Hawaii-specific requirement by obtaining credit hours in a continuing medication education course as provided in rules of the Hawaii Medical Board. <u>HB 1751, HD1</u> (HSCR622-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. Broadens the definition of renewable energy. (HB1751 HD1)	EEP, CPC
<u>HB 1823, HD1</u> (HSCR518-16) Status	RELATING TO NET ENERGY METERING. Increases capacity limits on net energy metering and establishes excess energy volumes for systems installed after June 30, 2016. (HB1823 HD1)	EEP, CPC

<u>HB 2077, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR625-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HYDROELECTRIC POWER. Permits hydroelectric facilities on Agricultural District lands that are considered small hydropower facilities under federal law. (HB2077 HD1)	EEP/WAL, CPC
<u>HB 2566, HD1</u> (HSCR655-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTRICITY. Establishes criteria for the Public Utility Commission's methodology in determining the rate that a public utility should pay a producer for nonfossil fuel-generated electricity that the producer supplies to the public utility. (HB2566 HD1)	EEP, CPC
HB 2081, HD1 (HSCR656-16) Status	RELATING TO ENERGY. Authorizes public agencies to initiate public purpose projects through which a public utility will purchase fuel or electricity. (HB2081 HD1)	EEP, CPC
