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<u>HB 2482, HD1</u> (HSCR387-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Requires managed care plans to provide claims data annually at no charge to a large group purchaser if the large group purchaser requests the information and meets certain requirements. <u>HB 1708, HD1</u> (HSCR200-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICINE AND SURGERY. Creates a limited licensing exemption for visiting sports team physicians. (HB1708 HD1)	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 2017</u> (HSCR189-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION TREATMENT PLANS. Allows physicians to submit workers' compensation treatment plans to employers by facsimile, the Internet, or secure electronic mail. Requires employers to accept electronically submitted treatment plans and provide an electronic receipt of the submission.	LAB, CPC
HB 2169, HD1 (HSCR542-16) Status	RELATING TO SOCIAL WORKERS. Clarifies the supervision requirements for licensure of clinical social workers, including permitting the supervision requirements to be met through face-to-face supervision or via a Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act-compliant video conferencing service. (HB2169 HD1)	HUS, CPC



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<u>HB 2233, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR547-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS. Requires every physician, osteopathic physician, or surgeon to: (1) complete a continuing medical education course that focuses on health issues with significant public health impact to the State; and (2) meet the Hawaii-specific requirement by obtaining credit hours in a continuing medication education course as provided in rules of the Hawaii Medical Board. HB 2077, HD1 (HSCR625-16) Status	RELATING TO HYDROELECTRIC POWER. Permits hydroelectric facilities on Agricultural District lands that are considered small hydropower facilities under federal law. (HB2077 HD1)	EEP/WAL, CPC
<u>HB 2567</u> (HSCR446-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION. Establishes "substantial net benefit" as the Public Utilities Commission's standard for a transfer or assignment of a franchise.	EEP, CPC
<u>SB 2107</u> (SSCR2388) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PEN REGISTERS. Amends the definition of "pen register" to include cell phones and other communications devices among those that the numbers transmitted to and from may be recorded.	CPC, JUD
<u>SB 646, SD2</u> (HSCR1101) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY. Permits the installation of clotheslines in any residential dwelling, apartment, condominium, or townhouse, under certain conditions. Defines a reasonable restriction on the placement and use of clotheslines as any restriction that is necessary to protect public health and safety, buildings from damage, historic or aesthetic values, or shorelines under certain circumstances. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)	EEP, CPC
<u>SB 1010, SD1, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR1188)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNAUTHORIZED PRACTICE OF LAW. Allows a person who is not licensed or authorized to practice law in the State to provide legal services on a temporary basis in this State if the attorney provides services in association with or assists a Hawaii licensed attorney or as in-house counsel to an organization in another jurisdiction or to an affiliated entity or employee of that organization in the State. Requires the clerk of the supreme court to maintain a registry of all attorneys who are not licensed or authorized to practice law in the State, but provide services for a matter that is not being litigated in any court of the State. Makes conforming amendments to attorney licensure requirements. Effective 3/15/2038. (HD1)	JUD, CPC
HCR 7 Status	REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE PROBABLE EFFECTS OF LICENSING AND REGULATING YOUTH SPORTS COACHES.	CPC, LMG, FIN
