Requires the board of dental examiners, Hawaii medical board, board of nursing, and board of pharmacy to summarily suspend a Hawaii license upon a determination that a licensee has had a license, registration, or ability to practice suspended or revoked in any other jurisdiction, pending a hearing to show cause. <u>SB 2864</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PHYSICIAN DISCIPLINE. Prohibits the licensee from practicing until a final order of discipline is issued if the licensee has been prohibited from practicing in another state.	<u>CPH, JDL</u> [Measure added on 01-29-16]
