Status & Testimony RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes the early language acquisition program to assess and track language development for children who are deaf, hard of hearing, and deaf-blind. Requires the departments of health and education to collaborate in the use of language assessments for children who are deaf, hard of hearing, and deaf-blind when developing individualized family support plans and individualized education plans in order to monitor language acquisition progress and implement appropriate language acquisition strategies to promote school readiness. Establishes the early language acquisition advisory committee to solicit input from experts on the selection of language developmental milestones. Makes an appropriation for the establishment of language developmental milestones and the corresponding parent resource and educator tools and assessments.
