Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Hawaii Renewable Resources, LLC, with the development of a natural gas production facility on Maui that will establish and fund food crops, with renewable natural gas and electricity production and related facilities and projects on the island of Maui. <u>SB 2021</u> ( <u>SSCR2568)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST BIOENERGY HAWAII, LLC. Extends the authorization of the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to BioEnergy Hawaii, LLC, for the purpose of establishing a cogeneration facility and related energy production facilities, for an additional five years. <u>SB 2738, SD2</u> <u>Proposed HD1</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. Proposed HD1: Replaces the current renewable energy technology systems tax credit with tax credits for solar energy property, wind energy property, and energy storage property. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2016. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds and makes an appropriation for the development of an electrolysis process hydrogen production, storage, and dispensing facility. Appropriates funds for the operation of the facility.	EEP, FIN



<u>SB-3126, SD2</u> ( <u>SSCR2787)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC-SCHOOLS. Provides for air conditioning, heat-abatement, and related energy efficiency measures at public schools-by-appropriating general funds and general obligation bond funds to the DOE for these-projects. (SD2)	<del>EEP, EDN, FIN</del>
<u>SB 2131, SD2</u> (SSCR2577) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY. Restores the amendments made to sections 243-1 and 243-4(a), HRS, which sunsetted on 12/31/2015. Clarifies that naphtha fuel, used in a power-generating facility, is subject to the fuel tax at a rate of 2 cents per gallon, retroactive to 1/1/2016. (SD2)	EEP, FIN
<u>HCR 87</u> <u>Status</u>	REQUESTING THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION TO ASSESS THE FEASIBILITY AND THE POTENTIAL MERITS AND BENEFITS OF THE ENERGY COOPERATIVE MODEL FOR THE ISLAND OF HAWAII.	EEP, CPC
