<u>HB 2224, HD1</u> (HSCR419-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Appropriates general funds for 4.0 FTE positions for the UH Pamantasan Council to promote access and diversity, including for programs and policies related to Philippine courses and Filipino students.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2539, HD2</u> (HSCR557-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Authorizes the establishment of health savings accounts in conjunction with group accident and health or sickness insurance policies, group hospital and medical service plan contracts, and health maintenance organization plans in the State.	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 1346, HD1</u> (HSCR301) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO YOUTH. Establishes a program within the office of youth services for positive youth development through after school and school break programs.	HUS, FIN
<u>HB 2226, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR464-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF LANGUAGE ACCESS. Appropriates funds for three full-time equivalent permanent positions within the Office of Language Access.	HUS, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 2560, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR607-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CORPORATIONS. Requires domestic and foreign corporations to provide their shareholders with reports of independent expenditures and political contributions.	JUD, FIN

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<u>HB 1902, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR610-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SEX TRAFFICKING. Replaces the offense of Promoting Prostitution in the First Degree with Sex Trafficking to be classified as a violent crime. Makes Sex Trafficking a class A felony and a strict liability offense if a minor is the victim of sex trafficking. Provides that the offense of prostitution for a person younger than eighteen years of age is a violation. Establishes a class C felony for the act of paying for sex in reckless disregard of the fact that the other person is a victim of sex trafficking. Expands the Department of the Attorney General's Statewide Witness Program to include sex trafficking; provides victims with access to criminal injury compensation; and amends laws relating to civil liability for cases of coercion into prostitution. Makes amendments to strengthen enforcement of laws and increase penalties against the sex trafficker.	JUD, FIN

<u>HB 2124, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR360-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INVESTMENT PERSONNEL OF THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Authorizes the ERS board to appoint investment professionals and support staff. Exempts appointed investment officers, professionals, and specialists from civil service law and collective bargaining. Provides option for incumbent investment specialists to remain subject to civil service law.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 2009, HD1</u> (HSCR467-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOISTING MACHINE OPERATORS. Repeals the Hoisting Machine Operators' Certification Revolving Fund and the position of the executive director. Tasks the DLIR with the responsibility of administrative duties for the Hoisting Machine Operators Advisory Board. Allows the Hoisting Machine Operators Advisory Board to establish fees for the issuance of permits or certificates by administrative rule.	LAB, FIN

<u>HB 2563, HD1</u> (HSCR594-16) Status	RELATING TO TOURISM. Appropriates funds for the restoration of a continuous beach and infrastructure for public access along the Waikiki waterfront.	OMH, FIN
<u>HB 2179, HD1</u> (HSCR459-16) Status	RELATING TO THE AHA MOKU ADVISORY COMMITTEE. Appropriates funds for the administration and operation of the aha moku advisory committee and for community outreach.	OMH, FIN
<u>HB 2188, HD1</u> (HSCR127-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HAWAII CORRECTIONAL INDUSTRIES. Authorizes Hawaii Correctional Industries to sell products and services on the open market to the general public.	PBS, FIN

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<u>HB 2250, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR337-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HIGHWAYS. Appropriates revenues for repair work and resurfacing of Kalani Street, Auld Lane, and Rawlins Lane on the island of Oahu.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 2049, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR650-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Authorizes the State or a county to obtain ownership over a road by condemnation pursuant to the State's powers of eminent domain. <u>HB 2090, HD1</u> (HSCR435-16) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LAND COURT. Streamlines the operations of the Office of the Assistant Registrar of the Land Court by removing the requirement that the Assistant Registrar certify pending certificates of title for fee time share interests.	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 2617, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR213-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LAND USE. Requires the counties to petition LUC to reclassify lands. Requires LUC to conduct the five year regional boundary change review.	WAL, FIN
