HB 1608 Status	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Appropriates moneys for the UH Graduation Pathway System.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 1883</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII CENTER ON AGING. Appropriates funds for a permanent full-time associate professor and permanent full-time assistant specialist position within the University of Hawaii center on aging.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 1609</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Requires the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to develop procedures for the full utilization of university facilities. Requires the administration of the different UH campuses to collect and report data relating to facilities utilization. Prohibits the UH board of regents from approving the construction of a new university building until a public hearing is held to discuss facility utilization and cost.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 1613</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION. Grants tuition waivers to students at the community colleges who meet certain criteria. Initiates the waiver program as a pilot project in a county with a population of less than 100,000.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 1703</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Appropriates moneys for the University of Hawaii to hire three psychologists and one case manager to provide student mental health services.	HED, FIN

Appropriates moneys to the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources for the restoration and preservation of historic relief maps of the Hawaiian islands.
