<u>Status</u>

Requires information on organ and tissue donation to be included in

the curriculum for the statewide driver education program and behind-

the-wheel driver training program.

<u>HB 1641</u>

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

HLT, TRN, JUD

Status

Authorizes the examiner of drivers to include information about a

person's disability on the person's driver's license or civil identification

card.

HB 1672

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUG BENEFITS.

HLT, CPC, JUD

Status

Authorizes a beneficiary of a prescription drug benefit plan to obtain a prescription without penalty from a non-network retail community pharmacy located within ten miles of the beneficiary's residence, if the nearest network retail community pharmacy is located over ten miles

away.

HB 1757 Status

RELATING TO HEALTH.

Authorizes a pharmacy to provide a customized patient medication package to any patient of an institutional facility or any member of the general public, subject to certain conditions.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
