<u>SB 2319, SD1</u> (SSCR2548) Status	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Requires all insurers in the State, including health benefits plans under chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and medicaid managed care programs, to cover reimbursement for contraceptive supplies intended to last for up to a twelve-month period for an insured. (SD1)	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2320, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2557)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONTRACEPTIVE SUPPLIES. Authorizes pharmacists to prescribe and dispense self-administered hormonal contraceptive supplies to persons eighteen years of age or older. Specifies requirements pharmacists must meet prior to prescribing and dispensing contraceptive supplies. Requires all insurers in the State, including health benefits plans under chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and medicaid managed care programs, to reimburse pharmacists who prescribe and dispense contraceptive supplies. (SD1)	HLT, CPC/JUE FIN
<u>SB 2007, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2551)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATE COUNCIL ON MENTAL HEALTH. Amends the membership of the State Council on Mental Health, defines quorum for the Council, and specifies number of votes required to constitute valid acts of the Council. Designates the State Council on Mental Health within the department of health for administrative purposes. (SD1)	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2383, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR2495)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH CONNECTOR. As part of the transition to a federally supported, state-based exchange: repeals the Hawaii health connector, updates an associated reference to the connector, and states that any debts and liabilities pertaining to the connector that were incurred prior to its repeal shall not constitute a debt or liability of the State. (SD2)	HLT, CPC, FIN



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<u>SB 2539, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2655)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE SPECIAL ACTION TEAM FOR THE HAWAII STATE HOSPITAL. Establishes a temporary special action team for the Hawaii state hospital to address the capacity and census issues at the hospital and the development there of a new forensic facility ready for occupancy by June 30, 2019. Appropriates \$50,000 in general funds for the team. (SD1)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 2675, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2556)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LICENSING. Authorizes the board of dental examiners, Hawaii medical board, and board of pharmacy to deny a license to an applicant who has been disciplined by another state or federal agency and the board of nursing to deny a license to an applicant who has been disciplined by another state agency. Authorizes the board of dental examiners, Hawaii medical board, board of nursing, and board of pharmacy to impose the same disciplinary action against a licensee as was taken by another state or federal agency. Establishes conditions for the disciplinary action. Prohibits a licensee from practicing until a final order of discipline is issued if the licensee has been prohibited from practicing in another state. Requires any final order of discipline taken to be public record. (SD1)	HLT, CPC, JUD
<u>SB 2883</u> (<u>SSCR2631)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AMENDING IDENTITY OF REGISTRANT'S PARENT ON A BIRTH CERTIFICATE. Clarifies that amendments to birth records that change parenthood shall not be conducted through the Uniform Information Practices Act procedures to correct personal records, but must be pursuant to a court order of appropriate jurisdiction or other legal establishment of parenthood.	HLT, JUD
