<u>SB 2311</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. Removes certain unnecessary and redundant reporting responsibilities of the family courts and the department of human services in cases where temporary restraining orders are sought for alleged domestic abuse involving a family or household member who is a minor or incapacitated person. <u>SB 1114</u> <u>Status &amp;</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Extends the date by which the Department of Health must post inspection reports for state-licensed care facilities by six months and increases the number of days to post the reports, as recommended by a legislative task force.	<u>HMS, CPH</u> [Measure added on 02/08/16]
