<u>SB 2425, SD1</u> (SSCR2175) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO ETHICS. Exempts extracurricular service of employees from the state ethics code if certain conditions are met. Defines detached remuneration and extracurricular service. (SD1)	EDU, JDL
<u>SB 2940, SD1</u> (SSCR2395) <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Clarifies that the State ethics code shall not apply to University of Hawaii employees who are directly involved in the research or development of technology sponsored and approved by the university when performing technology transfer activities. Requires such activities to comply with the regulatory framework and research compliance program approved by the board of regents. Requires a written status report to the legislature every two years. (SD1)	HEA/EET, JDL
<u>SB 2163, SD1</u> (SSCR2027) <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO SERVICE OF PROCESS. Allows notice of a water pollution and solid waste pollution violation to be given via a posting on a searchable government website when attempts to serve the notice in person and by mail have been unsuccessful. (SD1)	WLA, JDL
<u>SB 2857, SD1</u> (SSCR2319) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TOWING. Defines "vehicle owner", "scene", and "hooked up" for the purposes of towing unattended vehicles. Makes clarifying amendments. Specifies that violations of the section shall be per se violations of section 480-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and repeals prior fine provisions. Eff. 6/22/2022. (SD1)	TRE/CPH, JDL



SB 2912, SD1 (SSCR2093) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE INTEGRATED SEX OFFENDER TREATMENT PROGRAM. Amends chapter 353E, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to reflect nationally recognized best practices in the statewide, integrated program for sex offenders, and to identify the coordinating body for the sex offender treatment program as the "sex offender management team". Exempts the statewide integrated sex offender treatment program from the requirements of chapter 92, HRS. (SD1)	PSM, JDL
<u>SB 2916</u> (SSCR2309) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Includes misdemeanor offenses under chapter 134 (Firearms, Ammunition and Dangerous Weapons), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to the offenses that disqualify parolees from the provisions of Act 139, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012.	PSM, JDL
