NATIONAL MONUMENT.

Establishes the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument Program in HRS. Establishes criminal and administrative penalties. Allows DLNR to establish a fee schedule for services provided by the Monument Program. Provides for advice to the Governor and other state agencies regarding the Monument. Allows the Monument

Program to solicit and accept grants and donations.

HB 1041, HD1 (HSCR158) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO HUNTING.

WAL, JUD, FIN

Establishes the State Game Commission to serve in an advisory capacity to the BLNR. Appropriates funds. (HB1041 HD1)

<u>HB 799, HD1</u> (HSCR159)

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM AERONAUTICS ACT.

WAL, JUD

Clarifies the authority of the State, its employees, or its independent contractors, to remove birds or animals by aerial means in furtherance

of official State duties. (HB799 HD1)

HB 518, HD1 (HSCR151) Status

RELATING TO THE DISPOSITION OF PUBLIC LANDS.

WAL, JUD, FIN

Establishes within the department of land and natural resources, a fouryear public land lease pilot project in counties with a population between 170,000 and 200,000. Authorizes lessees of public land to relinquish a lease. Provides for the disposition of the land and

improvements at public auction after relinquishment. (HB518 HD1)

HB 1170, HD1 (HSCR252)

Revises statutory provisions relating to the regulation of mineral resources under chapters 171 and 182, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to

provide clarity and consistency. (HB1170 HD1)
