<u>SB 2723, SD1</u> RELATING TO ENFORCEMENT OF WAGE LAWS. (SSCR2650) Requires government contractors who violate wages and hours laws to pay a penalty that is equal to ten per cent of the amount of back wages Status due or \$1,000 per offense, whichever is greater, for the first offense; and a penalty equal to the amount of back wages found due or \$10,000 for each offense, whichever is greater, for the second offense. Effective January 7, 2059. (SD1)

SB 2694, SD1 (SSCR2660)

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY. Clarifies Hawaii's employment security law for independent

contractors. Includes twenty factors to be used as guidelines when determining whether an individual could be an independent contractor. Retains the ability of the department of labor and industrial relations to determine if an individual is an independent contractor. Requires the director of labor and industrial relations to report to the legislature prior to the regular session of 2017 regarding guidelines developed by the unemployment insurance coverage committee. Requires an annual report to the legislature regarding covered employment determinations. (SD1)

<u>SB 2840, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2565)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO REPORTING DEATHS TO STATE AGENCIES. Authorizes the DOH to continue to disclose, including through electronic means, lists of names of persons whose deaths have been recorded by DOH to state agencies that maintain official lists of persons and are prohibited by federal law from sharing information for the lists.
