RELATING TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

PBS, EEP/WAL,

Status

Creates an exemption from Hawai'i Revised Statutes §343-5 for a jail

FIN

facility to be built adjacent to Halawa Correctional Facility and

funding therefore and makes clarifying amendments.

<u>HB 1721</u> Status

RELATING TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

PBS, WAL, FIN

Requires the construction of a correctional facility at the Halawa Correctional Facility site to replace the existing OCCC. Requires a study on the feasibility of State redevelopment of the land that is

currently occupied by OCCC. Appropriates funds.

HB 2188 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO HAWAII CORRECTIONAL INDUSTRIES.

PBS, JUD, FIN

Authorizes Hawaii Correctional Industries to sell products and services

on the open market to the general public.

HB 2001

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

PBS, JUD, FIN

Status

Establishes a Commission on Criminal Justice and Sentencing Reform

in the Governor's Office. Requires the Commission to develop a statewide framework of sentencing and corrections policies to further reduce the State's incarcerated population by 25% by year 2025. The Commission shall also develop a plan to reduce spending on

corrections and reinvest in strategies to increase public safety and reduce recidivism.

HB 2190 Status

RELATING TO THE PUUHONUA COMMISSION.

PBS, JUD, FIN

Establishes the puuhonua commission within the department of public

safety to help post-incarcerated persons, probationers, and parolees reintegrate into society. Creates county advisory committees to advise

the commission. Establishes a special fund.

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HB 1706 Status

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

PBS, EDN, FIN

Establishes within DOE the youth civil defense corps. Requires BOE to adopt standards and curriculum for student participation.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least <u>24 hours</u> prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
