Status

Increases TAT. Requires distribution of one-half of TAT revenue collections to each county based on the proportion of TAT revenues generated by each county. Reduces the general excise tax rate for gross proceeds received on the sale of food or on the provision of medical expenses. Requires one-half of TAT revenues after distribution to the counties to be applied to reducing general excise tax

on fuel sold to consumer, fuel taxes, and county fuel taxes.
