2009-present: Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs University of Hawaii Community Colleges

- Direct reports: Director Strategic Planning and Institutional Research, Director Workforce Development, Director Academic Programs;
- Created and now direct a process for academic system planning: strategic numbers review, program performance review, workforce regional needs review;
- Created and implemented a system wide Student Success Council;
- Work with Chancellors on Strategic Planning, accreditation, academic trends and initiatives; data implications, personnel;
- Work with state agencies on issues related to CCs: Dept of Labor, Debt of Economic Development, etc.

- -Led innovation funding (\$950k) process for competitive faculty proposals;
 Achieving the Dream proposals; part-time students initiative; student services initiatives;
- -Part of lead team to initiate and deploy automatic admission and reverse transfer processes;
- -Helped write and submit Lumina grant to upgrade reverse transfer process:
- Designed and supervised the "overlay project": this structured pathways initiative connects the community college lower division curriculum to the top 30 transfer majors;

- Researched and assisted in design and deployment of performance funding model for the community college system; \$6m to be earned by satisfying selected goals (graduation, transfer, STEM, etc.) of the strategic planning indicators;
- -Presentations: national presentations on performance-based funding, accountability measures, transfer; presentations to UH system on trends in higher ed presentations (economic alignment, etc);
- -Co-Director, Interstate Passport Initiative: I designed the Passport initiative which allows students to transfer their gen ed/core requirements to any other Passport institution as a block. I presented this initiative to the Gates and Lumina Foundations receiving \$2.8 million to finish designing the multi state Passport.
- Workforce Initiatives: -Proposed and then collaborated with Hawaii Community College construction program to build a net zero house and to raise the standard for the annual model home project. Brought leading green building educator/consultant for their use, secured funds for materials and appliances to insure they met net zero rating; -Forged agreement with Hawaiian Homelands based on the successful completion of the net zero Hawaii CC house. HHL now offeres land and financing to any campus in the system that would build a similar eco-driven model home;
- -Worked with Dept. of Labor to host Skills Summits for tech, nursing, agriculture, and other crucial workforce areas such as creative industries; I am a member of the WDC;
- Collaborated with Dept. of Labor, congressional delegation, private sector and led workforce discussion resulting in successful grant submissions totaling over \$50 million in last 5 years; areas: health IT, alt energy, smart grid, etc. Won largest C3T grant in the nation;
- -Coordinate and lead faculty in system wide initiatives such as two sustainability summits that resulted in new BOR policy.
