Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to provide financing to assist West Maui Investors, LLC, with 2 Ukumehame reservoirs. HB2199 RELATING TO TRANSIT ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT. TRN/WAL, EDB, Establishes a Transit Oriented Development Authority within the FIN Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to oversee and manage development of infrastructure on state lands within one-quarter mile radius of rail stations. RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN RESOURCES. HB2200 OMH, WAL, FIN Authorizes the BLNR Chairperson to transfer public land trust funds to the Kaho'olawe Rehabilitation Trust Fund. Authorizes the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to expend public land trust funds for purposes consistent with those of the Kaho'olawe Rehabilitation Trust Fund. RELATING TO CRIMINAL PROCEDURE. JUD HB2201 Prohibits deferred acceptance of a guilty or no contest plea where the defendant has been charged with committing an offense against a family or household member. HB2202 RELATING TO SCHOOL IMPACT FEE EXEMPTIONS FOR WAL, EDN, FIN HOUSING PROJECTS. Clarifies that housing projects claiming an exemption pursuant to chapter 201H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, cannot claim an exemption from the school impact fee. HB2203 RELATING TO FORCE-PLACED INSURANCE. CPC, FIN Requires financial institutions and mortgage servicers to provide written notice to borrowers regarding the status of their insurance coverage; obtain force-placed insurance subject to certain

conditions; and terminate and refund any moneys to the borrower

upon receipt of the confirmation of a borrower's existing

insurance coverage.

Requires DLIR to place redacted advisory opinions on its website. Requires DLIR to respond to an employer's appeal of a determination of employment status within 30 days or the appeal will be dismissed in favor of the employer.

Specifies that employers may take adverse employment action for reasons other than those currently protected under Hawaii's

HB2210 RELATING TO COASTAL PROTECTION. OMH/WAL, FIN

Authorizes counties to establish a surcharge on real property taxes collected from oceanfront properties. Requires counties to deposit surcharges collected into a special fund to be used for coastal protection and management programs and activities.

#### REFERRAL HB2211 RELATING TO HEALTH. HLT, CPC, FIN Establishes the Health Care Task Force (Task Force) to develop a plan to improve the delivery of health care in the State, including ways to address the shortage of physicians statewide. Appropriates funds for the Task Force. RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. HB2212 HED, JUD Provides that an attorney or a non-attorney advocate may represent a student during non-academic disciplinary hearings or appeals that could result in suspension or expulsion. RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION. HED, FIN HB2213 Establishes a state funds matching grant program for resident undergraduate UH students with financial need and whose parents have not earned a baccalaureate or higher degree. HB2214 RELATING TO PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS. EDN, JUD, FIN Simplifies the process for an entity to become an authorizer (an entity that approves or denies applications to become a charter school). Establishes a shortened timeline for the release of charter school funds. Authorizes charter schools to retain attorneys for charter contract negotiation, charter revocation, and charter nonrenewal processes. HB2215 RELATING TO OFFENSES INVOLVING THE JUD CONFINEMENT OR RESTRAINT OF DOGS. Establishes the criminal offense of unlawful confinement or restraint of a dog to enhance related offenses under the cruelty to animals law and provide standards for the use of tethers and enclosures for dogs. HB2216 RELATING TO PUBLIC BUILDINGS. JUD, FIN Requires single-occupancy restrooms in all public buildings to be gender-neutral, with appropriate signage. RELATING TO AMENDING OR REPEALING HAWAII **FIN** HB2217 REAL PROPERTY TAX LAWS FOR THE PURPOSE OF DELETING OBSOLETE OR UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS. Repeals various sections of the real property tax laws for the purpose of deleting obsolete and unnecessary provisions. RELATING TO AMENDING OR REPEALING HAWAII **FIN** HB2218 INCOME TAX LAWS FOR THE PURPOSE OF DELETING OBSOLETE OR UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS. Amends various sections of the income tax law for the purpose

HB2229 EDB, FIN Establishes the Hawaii Sports Task Force to plan and coordinate efforts to keep the Pro Bowl in Hawaii, and to secure Hawaii as a host site for a National Football League preseason game, worldtitle soccer tournaments at Aloha Stadium, mixed martial arts Ultimate Fighting Championship tournaments at Aloha Stadium, and other international sporting events. HB2230 RELATING TO TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY. TOU, CPC, FIN Requires hosting platforms that offer or advertise a residential unit on the Internet for transient occupancy to report certain information annually to the DCCA. Provides for administrative fine to be deposited into the compliance resolution fund. HB2231 RELATING TO ENERGY COOPERATIVES. EEP, FIN Clarifies that a publicly owned energy cooperative may be considered an energy project and project party for purposes of receiving financing through special purpose revenue bonds. RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. **HB2232** EEP/HLT, CPC, Phases out the use of polystyrene foam (styrofoam) containers by FIN restaurants, food establishments, hotels, and food packagers beginning 1/1/17. Prohibits all expanded polystyrene foam use beginning 1/1/23. Authorizes DOH to allow exemptions. HB2233 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS. HLT, CPC Requires health care professionals to take a continuing medical education course in health issues unique to Hawaii. Requires the DOH to develop the course, in consultation with the Hawaii medical board. HB2234 RELATING TO DENGUE FEVER. HLT, LMG, FIN Requires the auditor to conduct a management audit to evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness of the disease outbreak control division of the department of health in the division's response to the 2015 outbreak of dengue fever on the island of Hawaii. Appropriates funds to the department of health for mosquito assessment and control efforts for the island of Hawaii to assist in reducing the occurrence and combatting the risk of dengue fever.

EEP, CPC, FIN Replaces the current renewable energy technology systems tax credit with tax credits for solar energy property, wind energy property, and energy storage property. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2016. HB2237 RELATING TO THE STATE INTEGRATED SOLID WASTE EEP. FIN MANAGEMENT PLAN. Appropriates funds to the department of health to support the revision of the state integrated solid waste management plan. HB2238 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE EEP, FIN REVENUE BONDS FOR HAWAII RENEWABLE RESOURCES, LLC. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Hawaii Renewable Resources, LLC, with the development of a natural gas production facility on Maui that will establish and fund food crops, with renewable natural gas and electricity production and related facilities and projects on the island of Maui. HB2239 RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES. TRN, EEP, FIN Authorizes the public benefits fee to be used to install and upgrade electric power infrastructure to facilitate the use of electric vehicles. Authorizes the public benefits fee administrator to establish procedures for the administration of public benefits fee programs that install or upgrade electric power infrastructure to facilitate the use of electric vehicles. Sunsets on 6/30/2020. HB2240 RELATING TO ENERGY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HED, FIN HAWAII. Establishes the University of Hawaii green special fund within UH to reduce energy consumption and costs. HB2241 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. EDB, FIN Requires the state procurement policy board to perform annual random audits of government purchasing agencies and audits of

agencies selected based on a pattern of agency noncompliance.
