### **RE: GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 560**

Dear Chair Baker:

Thank you for this opportunity to tell you a little bit about myself in your consideration of my confirmation to the Disability and Communication Access Board (DCAB).

My name is Colin Whited and I am a resident of Hawai'i's 10<sup>th</sup> Senatorial District. My intrigue in the field of disability and communication access begins with my personal background. For starters, I am Deaf. I grew up in a Deaf household, where my parents and only sibling – a younger sister – are also Deaf. In fact, I have had Deaf people in my family dating back to the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. I grew up attending a bilingual-bicultural residential school for the and subsequently enrolled at Gallaudet University, the only higher education institution in which all programs are specifically designed to accommodate deaf and hard-of-hearing students. So, as you may see, I am no stranger when it comes to being in environments that are accessible to persons with communication disabilities.

Upon graduating from Gallaudet with a Bachelors in Government and minors in Business Administration and History, I was hired by the Pacific Disabilities Center of the University of Hawai'i John A. Burns School of Medicine, where I am currently employed as its Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Project Specialist. I have been involved with several organizations at the local level, including the Aloha State Association of the Deaf, the Hawai'i School for the Deaf and the Blind School Community Council, and the Georgia E. Morikawa Center. In addition, I have been a part of DCAB as an interim appointment since November 23, 2015, where I have had the pleasure of serving on the Standing Committee on Communication Access and the Legislative Committee.

I have a particular interest in the complexity of disability access laws, as there is no "one size fits all" equation for ensuring access. Many view such complexities as hindrances. I believe them to be opportunities to mold society into a better place for all. That having been said, it would be an honor to continue representing the deaf and hard of hearing community on DCAB. I ask for you to support my nomination. Thank you.
