Dear Senator Taniguchi and Members of the Committee:

It is my honor to write a letter of support on behalf of Jan Sullivan's nomination to serve another five years as a Regent of the University of Hawaii. We are indeed fortunate to have Regent Sullivan agree to seek another five-year term as her institutional knowledge and the work she has begun--with fellow board members, the UH administration and staff, and members of the business community--can be further advanced.

During her first term, Regent Sullivan has been an advocate for students seeking an affordable education, financial and operational transparency and efficiency, and innovation and entrepreneurship within the University of Hawaii. She is not afraid to voice a contrary opinion or ask difficult questions in an effort to enhance the conversation and gain a better understanding of complex issues. She does her homework and holds staff accountable. These are qualities we need in our Regents as they work through difficult issues currently challenging the University.

I have had the opportunity to work with Regent Sullivan in my role as the Executive Director of the Pacific Asian Center for Entrepreneurship (PACE) at the Shidler College of Business. Working together with Vassilis Syrmos, the Vice President of Research and Innovation at UH Manoa, Regent Sullivan has shared her extensive knowledge and network of contacts in Silicon Valley. Her knowledge of technology transfer between the university and the private sector has also led to commercialization models and ideas currently being employed. It has been a joy to work with Regent Sullivan, Dr. Syrmos and Dr. Vance Roley, Dean of the Business School and Dr. Peter Crouch, Dean of the College of Engineering on new entrepreneurial efforts. It is safe to say that the University of Hawaii has never been more entrepreneurial or a more thorough understanding of the work needed to be done to become an economic driver of the innovation economy here in Hawaii. We MUST continue this good work. Regent Sullivan is an important part of this innovation evolution. Her many years at Oceanit, the largest science and engineering company in Hawaii, is the practical guidance and understanding we currently need to achieve our innovation goals.
