The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) expresses its strong support for Governor's Message 746 on the confirmation of Benjamin Shafer as a gubernatorial appointed member to the Kahana Valley Living Park Planning Council (Planning Council) for a term to expire on June 30, 2019.

Aloha Kakou Honorable Senator Mike Gabbard, Chair and Members of the Water, Land and Agricultural Committee,

Below is my response to the questionnaire that you recently sent to me for the Kahana Planning Council.

(1) Why do you wish to be a member of the Kahana Valley Living Park Planning Council?

Certainly, I would have preferred the Kahana Planning Council's (KPC) work would be up and running by now. With no funding from the Legislature or DLNR and several attempts for GIA being denied either by the Legislature or lack of support on the part of State Parks for our grassroots 501(c)3 to receive funding to get paid professional planners is critical for the success of the KPC.

Department of Land and Natural Resources is now funding the creation of the Master Plan. Now we can collaborate with Planners in fulfilling our kuleana.

(2) How do you perceive the role and responsibilities of a member of the Kahana Valley Living Park Planning Council?

The kuleana of the KPC is to create a comprehensive master plan utilizing the gifts and talents of its residents with the knowledge from all the past plans of Kahana. Being a member and Co-Chair of two prior Kahana Advisory Councils II & III(KAC), a member and Vice President of the Kahana Ohana Unity Council (KOUC) which later became the Kahana Community Association (KCA) and President of Friends of Kahana (FOK), a 501(c) 3 Non-Profit Organization whose purpose are to seek funding for Hawaiian Culture projects within the Ahupua'a O' Kahana, I feel that I would have a positive and forward thinking ability to move this Master Plan towards completion and implementation.

I don't think I was naive the last time to think we could have and should have done more, but now there is funding for planners to assist us will be a monumental change as far a movement and accomplishments.
