Good morning Chair Agaran, Vice Chair Shimabukuro and members of the Committee on Judiciary and Labor. He has over fifteen (15) years of experience in professional staffing in Hawaii. Under Mr. Knox's management HiEmployment has grown to exceed \$12 million in revenue, increased staff to 22, and placed 1,800 employees in 2014. HiEmployment currently has locations on all major islands and places employees in the agriculture, construction, office professional, hospitality, technical, and education sectors.

Mr. Knox's experience working with both employers and potential employees will be valuable to

WDC as WIOA places more emphasis on engaging employers across the workforce system to align training with needed skills and matching employers with qualified workers.

In this critical year, WDC has been preparing the Hawaii WIOA Unified State Plan. The plan covers the six core formula grant programs authorized under WIOA and outlines the state's vision and strategy for carrying out activities under each program. The WIOA plan is a requirement in order for Hawaii to receive the bulk of federal funding for the State's primary job training and placement activities.

I respectfully urge you to confirm Mr. Knox as a member of the Workforce Development Council where he would be a valuable asset to the Council.
