Aloha Senator Gabbard:

This is prepared in response to questions posed regarding my appointment to the Agribusiness Development Corporation (ADC). I appreciate the opportunity to share my thought and ask for your support of my nomination to continue to serve on the ADC Board.

(1) Why do you wish to be a member of the Board of Directors of the agribusiness Development Corporation?

I have been privileged to serve on the Board of the Corporation and am seeking a second term on the Board. Everyone talks about Hawaii becoming more sustainable and reducing our reliance on imports, but the critical part of that equation is that Hawaii needs to grow more with greater economies of scale. Otherwise, very little will change. The purchase and preservation of lands at Whitmore (Galbraith) has presented a great opportunity for affordable ag lands to be available for farmers who have experience farming and want to expand their operations. It will certainly be an accomplishment for the State and ADC to put farmers on the land after several years of land preparation, infrastructure improvements, as well selection and training of farmers. I would truly like to see these efforts come to fruition.

(2) How do you perceive the role and responsibilities of a member of the Board of Directors of the Agribusiness Development Corporation?I feel that we must be advocates for the growth of agriculture in Hawaii. We must support the farmers that grow food responsibly but we must also seek new and different ways to make agriculture more profitable, more exciting through opening new markets, developing new crops, and fostering growth of more value added products.

(3) Given your understanding of the role and responsibilities of a member of the Board of Directors of the Agribusiness Development Corporation, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position?



Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise, or knowledge that would aid in your decision-making ability as a member of the Board of Directors of the Agribusiness Development Corporation. I have been blessed to have career opportunities that challenged me as well as helped me to grow both professionally and personally. My years at the Hawaii State Legislature were important in my understanding of the workings of the legislature. My tenure in the Department of Health, Office of Environmental Quality Control, taught me a lot about land use issues, the preparation, review and approval of environmental impact statements, balancing issues and negotiating outcomes. My many years at the Hawaii Department of Agriculture, culminating in serving as the Department's Deputy Director, gave me insights, networking opportunities with industry and understanding the issues facing agriculture. I currently serve as Marketing Director for Armstrong Produce which has allowed me to continue working with growers throughout the state and to have a more global understanding of what changes are taking place in agriculture. All these experiences have broadened my understanding of what it takes to survive in a global economy, and insights as to what might make Hawaii agriculture more successful.

(4) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service? I am confident that we will have approximately a dozen small farmers growing crops on Galbraith lands to help increase local food production within a few months. I am also hopeful that Galbraith can serve as template for other agricultural areas on the neighbor islands. I hope that farmers will succeed and thrive both in growing crops and developing value added products as well.

(5) Name three qualities that best describe you and that would make you stand out. How would these qualities benefit the Board of Directors of the Agribusiness Development Corporation?

I am a good people person and communicate well with individuals from all walks of life.

I am proactive, open to change, watch trends, and embrace new technology that can help agriculture as well as life in general. I am always willing to share knowledge and experiences to help others in different phases of their life or professional career.



The ADC Board members should be knowledgeable about agriculture, but also innovators, out of the box thinkers and decision makers. The qualities I possess will be helpful toward resolving issues and new challenges facing the Board.

(6) Name one previous experience that would make you stand out. How would this benefit the Board of Directors of the Agribusiness Development Corporation?

Farmers come to me with ideas about what they want to grow or ask what they should grow. Based on sales of products and how much of a product is imported, I will offer suggestions by going over with them acreage requirements, growth timeline (pineapple takes 18 months vs. 6 weeks for green onions), soil and environmental conditions, financial requirements, as well as labor and equipment needs, etc. In the process of focusing and narrowing the field to what is possible, what the farmer is passionate about, what is doable, we come to work out what is realistic and unique to help the farmer carve out a plan for his future. I think my abilities compliment this kind of request which is needed on many Board issues.

(7) Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interests that could arise during your service on the Board of Directors of the Agribusiness Development Corporation?

I am hopeful that my professional experiences in the field of agriculture will actually enhance and help the Board with the challenges we will face as we forge ahead with new plans and new directions. If a conflict should arise, I would certainly recuse myself from the decision making process to avoid conflict.
