Q&A

(1) Why do you want to be a member of the Board?

I would like to contribute my experience and knowledge to the Board.

(2) What do you perceive are the roles and responsibilities of a member of the Board?

The responsibility includes reviewing applications for sufficient and appropriate qualifications to receive contractor's licenses. However, that is only a portion of the Board's responsibility. Some others include resolving contractor's license scope interpretations and license disputes, fitting ambiguous scopes into appropriate categories and addressing new license categories as industry technologies evolve.

(3) In what ways do you feel that you can help protect the consumer?

Generally, it's a matter of public safety. The first line of protection is preventing improperly qualified contractors from doing the work. This gets to be more and more important as the specialty contractors embrace the newer technologies.

(4) Given your understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a Board member, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position? Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise and knowledge that would aid you as a member of the Board.

I have over 30 years industry experience, starting as journeyman pipefitter-welder, and progressing up the many steps to become a successful owner and president of a large heavy industrial general contractor (power plants, refineries, wastewater plants, and renewable energy). I have utilized the experiences in my 5-year tenure as a CLB member, of which I was Vice Chairman for the last 1-1/2 years.

(5) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service? Continue the current path of the CLB to address the needs created by the evolving construction industry.
