In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 881 SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLANDS OF KAUAI AND NIIHAU, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, KEITH YAP FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-2020

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 881, nominating Mr. Keith Yap to the Island Burial Council, Islands of Kauai and Niihau expiring June 30, 2020.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. With regard to previously known burials, the Burial Councils determine whether to leave the burial in place or remove it, recognize lineal and cultural descendants and provide counsel and advice to the Department.

Large landowner representatives must be currently employed or associated with a developer who conducts large scale land development activities or a large property owner who owns or leases at least 100 acres of land on the respective island, and represent the interest of the development or large property owner.

Mr. Yap holds a Bachelor of Business Administration-Accounting from the University of Hawaii. He is a Certified Public Accountant and is currently employed at Gay & Robinson as its Director of Administration and Treasurer. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accounts and the Hawaii Society of Certified Public Accounts. More importantly, he is a current member of the Kauai Niihau Islands Burial Council and serves as its Chair. In this capacity, he has earned the respect of his fellow members as well as the general Kauai community.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Mr. Yap's knowledge and perspective continues to inform the deliberations of the Kauai Niihau Islands Burial Council until June 30, 2020.
