#### In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 884 SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLANDS OF KAUAI AND NIIHAU, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, SANDRA QUINSAAT FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-2020

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 884, nominating Ms. Sandra Quinsaat to the Island Burial Council, Islands of Kauai and Niihau expiring June 30, 2020.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. With regard to previously known burials, the Burial Councils determine whether to leave the burial in place or remove it, recognize lineal and cultural descendants and provide counsel and advice to the Department.

Ms. Quinsaat is a Project Manager at the Grand Hyatt Kauai Resort and Spa. While working there and participating in construction projects, she gained experience and learned the statutes and rules regarding the disposition of human skeletal remains. She also dealt with the discovery of human skeletal remains at other properties such as The Point at Poipu, the Marriott Waiohai, and the Sheraton Kauai Resort. Thus, she understands the sensitive nature of the process. Ms. Quinsaat is also a past member of the Kauai Niihau Islands Burial Council.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Ms. Quinsaat's knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Kauai Niihau Islands Burial Council until June 30, 2020.

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) <u>SUPPORTS</u> GM884, which confirms OHA Nominee Sandra "Sandi" Quinsaat as a Kōloa regional representative to the Kaua'i and Ni'ihau Island Burial Council.

Ms. Quinsaat has expressed a life-long commitment to keeping our cultural traditions pono. She has gained much experience with burials law and practices as well as collaborative problem solving when she previously served on the Kaua'i/Ni'ihau Island Burial Council. As a project manager at the Grand Hyatt Kaua'i Resort & Spa Ms. Quinsaat has witnessed many burial discoveries during construction of the Hyatt as well as neighboring hotels. In many cases, she assisted with reinterment protocols, always seeking the advice and respect of kūpuna. These are important attributes for Council members whose primary purpose is to serve that the best interests of kūpuna and surviving 'ohana and descendants.

Ms. Quinsaat also maintains strong connections with the community and strives to protect cultural traditions. She currently serves on the Protocol Committees at the Hyatt and with Nā Kalai Wa'a o Kaua'i. In this capacity, she is currently working on the birthing chant of Kaua'i's voyaging canoe "Namahoe". Also, Ms. Quinsaat dances hula with Hula Hālau Na Hui O Kamakaokalani. Ms. Quinsaat has been a strong voice for kūpuna in the Kōloa community for many years and would make an excellent addition to this Council.

For these reasons, OHA urges the committee to **PASS** GM884 to confirm Ms. Quinsaat to the Kaua'i and Ni'ihau Island Burial Council. Mahalo for the opportunity to testify on this important measure.
