Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,932 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interest of our diverse agricultural community.

HFB strongly supports HB 1345 HD 1 SD 1, appropriating funds for the operation, repair, maintenance, and improvement of the East Kauai Irrigation System by the East Kauai Water Users' Cooperative.

The East Kauai Water Users' Cooperative, a volunteer group, has operated the East Kauai Irrigation System for more than eight years, servicing more than 12,500 acres of agricultural land.
