PURPOSE: The purposes of H.B. 1347 HD 1 is to appropriate funds to the Department

of Human Services to increase staff, improve systems and contract for necessary services related to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) supports

the intent of this measure and appreciates the Legislature's continued support of the DHS's

Benefit, Employment, and Support Services Division (BESSD), and BESSD's efforts in

administering the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

The DHS has requested funding for staffing and modernization efforts to improve on its administration of the SNAP Program through the Executive Budget. We ask for the Legislature's support of the Executive Budget request.

Please pass HB 1347:

The wealthiest individuals in our state, country, and world are gaining increasing amounts of power and control over the money and resources that are available. This phenomenon is due to their high positions within society as well as tax codes that benefit wealthy individuals, CEOs and managers of large organizations, and large organizations themselves.

Since the tax codes and rapid rates of inflation benefit the wealthy while disadvantaging the middle class, working class, and working pool, it is contributing to a shrinking middle class as well as a growth in the working class and working poor populations. Therefore, the demand for SNAP benefits will grow as the rates of poverty increase at faster rates than adequate pay structures do for middle class, working class, and impoverished people within their jobs. A greater number of employees within the SNAP program is crucial in meeting this demand.

While increasing the number of SNAP employees as well as SNAP recipients may place an immediate tax burden upon society, this tax burden is trivial compared to the consequences of not addressing the issue of hunger that SNAP seeks to alleviate. These consequences include crime triggered by attempts to get food, short-term and long-term medical conditions caused by a lack of adequate nutrition, and many others.
