In 2019 when the affordability period expires, low-income families currently living in these affordable units will be forced to move out and seek other housing accommodations. because they will not be able to afford the market rents. Authorizing the issuance of General Obligations Bonds and appropriating moneys for the purchase of properties on the east side of Kaua'i will ensure the availability of and address the urgent need for affordable rental housing for qualified families.
