As the Council of Delegates Hawaii Representative of the Orthopaedic Sports Medicine Society, a resident in your district, a practicing sports medicine orthopedic surgeon on Oahu, and a member of the Hawaii Orthopedic Association, I respectfully write to express my strong support for H.B. No. 1708-Chapter 453-Visiting sports team physician: licensure exemption.

This bill would enable a physician who is currently licensed in good standing to practice medicine in another state, to be exempt for the licensure requirements in Hawaii while practicing in Hawaii temporarily if he or she meets these requirements: 1) the physician has a written or oral agreement with a sports team to provide care to the team members and/or coaching staff traveling with the team to Hawaii for a specific sporting event to take place in here in Hawaii, 2) The physician has been invited by a national sport governing body to provide services to team members and coaching staff at a national sport training center in Hawaii, or 3) To provide services at an event or competition in Hawaii that is sanctioned by the national sport governing body.

This bill serves to protect the ability of visiting physicians to legally care for their team members, coaching staff, cheer leaders, etc. who may be sick or injured while on official travel with the team event. **It does not affect local physicians** nor put in legal jeopardy any entities in Hawaii. This same legislation has already been voted into law in over 30 states, thus allowing reciprocity for visiting team physicians. Your support of this legislation will allow Hawaii to join the ranks of most US states (with all others in various states of passage), to protect the ability of the visiting team physicians to care for their team members while briefly visiting our paradise.
