## 1 **Fiscal Implications:** None.

2 **Department Testimony:** The Department supports this measure with comments. The

3 Department does not have the resources to develop its own standards for household aerobic

4 treatment units. Instead, the Department relies on the standards for household aerobic treatment

5 units established by the National Sanitation Foundation/American National Standards Institute

6 (NSF/ANSI). Currently, Hawaii Administrative Rules, Chapter 11-62, "Wastewater Systems,"

7 require household aerobic treatment units to have a NSF/ANSI Standard 40 certification.

8 However, the NSF/ANSI Standard 40 does not address nitrogen reduction in the treated effluent.

9 Household aerobic treatment units with NSF/ANSI Standard 245 certification can help meet the

10 growing demand for nutrient reduction in coastal areas and sensitive environments. The

11 NSF/ANSI Standard 245 has performance measures that reduces the amount of nitrogen

12 discharged into surface waters by at least 50 percent in some watersheds. Improved wastewater

13 treatment is one of the most effective ways to reduce nitrogen pollution in water. The

14 Department agrees that household aerobic units that discharge their effluent directly to

15 groundwater should be required to meet the requirements of NSF/ANSI Standard 245.

16 The Department recommends deleting section (c) of the measure. Violations are already

17 enforceable under Hawaii Revised Statutes, Section 342D-9.

18 Provided below are the Department's suggested amendments for this measure.

1 Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

Offered Amendments: Section (b) should be revised as follows, "The director shall approve household aerobic units based on the National Sanitation Foundation/American National Standards Institute Standard 245 for class I aerobic units." We also recommend deleting section (c) as it is unnecessary.
