A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CORAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The University of Hawaii shall conduct a study 2 on the effects of sunscreen used by swimmers and other ocean 3 users on the coral reefs located in Hawaii waters. The study 4 shall include recommendations on how to mitigate the detrimental 5 effects to coral, if any, caused by sunscreen, giving due 6 consideration to the need to protect the coral reefs and the 7 possible impact that mitigation measures may have on residents 8 and visitors who use sunscreen. 9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to study 12 the effects of sunscreen on coral reefs in Hawaii waters.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. The University of Hawaii shall submit a

 16 preliminary report to the legislature no later than twenty days

 17 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2017 and a

- 1 final report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 2 to the convening of the regular session of 2018. The reports
- 3 may include proposed legislation.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
