Chairpersons Keith-Agaran and Tokuda and Members of the Committees:

Thank for the opportunity to testify on House Bill No. 1996 HD1. The bill proposes to establish a two-year pilot project to investigate and prosecute agricultural theft and vandalism. The bill will dedicate an enforcement officer specifically to prosecuting agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism incidences in the county of Hawaii; identify best practices for prevention and provide recommendations for a statewide program to address agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism. The department supports this bill provided that it does not impact the priorities submitted in the department's executive budget.

This measure establishes a two-year Agricultural Theft Pilot Project in the Department of Agriculture to focus on investigating and prosecuting agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism in the County of Hawai'i. Appropriates funds.

Agricultural theft and vandalism in the county of Hawai'i is not only an impediment to running a successful and profitable farming operation, but can also prove harmful to consumers. In 2011, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) halted the importation of all Mexican-sourced papayas into the United States. The FDA found salmonella in about 16% of imported papayas from Mexico and the finding of this human pathogen in papayas caused the FDA to stop the importation of a food-source from the entire country of Mexico. We cannot allow this to happen here. At the time, 65% of all U.S. imported papayas came from Mexico.

Hawai'i county is the breadbasket of the State. Having the ability to identify and track the sources of agricultural products from field to table is crucial in the event a contamination is found to exist.

Agricultural theft is a serious, ongoing problem statewide, with farmers reporting the theft of crops, animals, equipment/tools, and vandalized fences and gates. Much of the theft and trespass goes unreported, as a result, the actual losses can only be estimated, but are believed by

many industry experts to run from hundreds of thousands of dollars to millions annually. This pilot project will provide an enforcement officer within the county of Hawai'i with the ability to focus on investigating and prosecuting these agricultural issues, as our over-tasked police department does not have the ability to provide a permanent officer to investigate agricultural crimes.

This pilot project has the capability to increase the safety and sustainability of our farming and agricultural industry by allowing farmers to focus less on the security of their crops and more on high-quality products and safe farming techniques. By having a committed investigator when crime, vandalism, or contamination of our agricultural products occur, we will be able to act swiftly and decisively to tackle the issues.
