## In consideration of HB2264 HD1 RELATING TO THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

Chair Wakai, Vice Chair Slom, and Members of the Committee on Economic Development, Environment and Technology.

The High Technology Development Corporation (HTDC) supports with requested amendments HB2264 HD1 that makes an appropriation to the High Technology Development Corporation for the provision of technology internship grants and development of programs to support the local talent pipeline for the technology industry.

As part of HTDC's vision to create 80,000 new innovation jobs in Hawaii earning \$80,000 or more by 2030, HTDC supports initiatives aimed at strengthening the local talent pipeline for the technology industry.

The bill requests HTDC to provide grants to companies which would require more specific language to implement. Instead, HTDC respectfully suggests the following changes to Section 2 of the bill which would clarify that the funding provided would be specific to funding internship opportunities at technology companies.

"SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to fund technology **internships** and the development of programs to further the pipeline of talent in Hawaii for technology fields, which may include skills assessment, program development, seminars, and training; provided that no **intern** shall receive more than \$2,500 per year and no company shall receive more than \$5,000 per year for this purpose."
