## In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2558 RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT

House Bill 2558 proposes to require state agencies to participate in a carbon offset program to reduce carbon emissions caused by their employees' air travel, and would require the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish and administer this program. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this measure and provides the following comments.

Forests produce a wide range of ecosystem benefits; are an integral part of Hawaiian cultural practices; support recreational activities such as hiking and hunting; provide open space and aesthetic beauty; provide outdoor classrooms for environmental education; and provide sustainable income from various forest resources.

The Department recognizes that air travel by state employees' produces carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gas emissions that contribute to global climate effects. Forestation projects involving planting trees can sequester substantial amounts of carbon dioxide, as well as provide a variety of ecological, cultural, recreational, educational, and economic benefits.

The Department notes that establishing and administering a carbon offset program, as described in this bill, would require a monetary investment in the startup phase. However, as the program develops, fees paid to the Department from respective state employee offset costs should cover program maintenance costs, and serve as a revenue stream to accelerate the number of trees planted and cared for by afforestation or reforestation projects. The Department suggests integrating these costs when contemplating the establishment of this program.
